

WALTER R. COLLINS WILDLIFE BIOLOGY SCHOLARSHIPS

These scholarships are sponsored and funded by the Arizona Bowhunters Association.

OBJECTIVE:

The awards of \$1,000 may be made annually, payable \$500 each of two semesters. When feasible, the three scholarships will be awarded to students from each of the Arizona state universities. However, the scholarships may go to the three most qualified Arizona students.

Regardless of their enrollment. Final determination of awards will be made by quorum vote

of the Arizona Bowhunters Association Board of Directors.

ELIGIBILITY:

Applicants must meet the following criteria:

1. Completion of two years of study in an accredited College or University.
2. Have a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 (on a 4.0 point scale).
3. Be enrolled as a Junior, Senior, or Graduate in a Wildlife management, wildlife biology, or related Forestry program, working toward the next degree.

4. Must be a resident of Arizona for the previous 12 Months and possess in-state residency status at The University of Arizona, Arizona State University, or Northern Arizona University.
5. Must be enrolled as a full-time student with a minimum of 12 credit hours per semester, actively pursuing a career in wildlife management, wildlife biology, or related forestry field.
6. Must have held one of the following wildlife-related positions with the Arizona Game & Fish Department, US Forest Service, US Fish & Wildlife Service, Bureau of Land Management, National Park Service, or Bureau of Indian Affairs within the last three years: (a) volunteer or reserve status, (b) seasonal, (c) temporary, or (d) intern.

APPLICATIONS:

The completed application form must be accompanied by the student's letter of career intent,

a minimum of two letters of reference from any of the agencies listed in Paragraph 6 above,

and a recommendation from the university. Send applications to the address below by the end
